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## Quick Overview of the Course - Its Unique Features

1. Comprehensive subjects based on the rich Nalanda tradition of Buddhist Philosophy, in order to fulfill the wish of His Holiness the Dalai Lama, to make this infinitely precious legacy available to as many people as possible, in an easy and accessible form.
2. Teachings given directly in English language.
3. Teachings given by teachers with Geshe Degrees (the monastic equivalent of a PhD) .
4. Flexibility to attend classes in person OR online mode.
5. Flexibility to choose the mode - Assignment Mode ( relatively lesser time commitment besides listening to the teachings ) OR Exam Mode ( relatively greater time commitment besides listening to the teachings ).
6. Highly subsidized fees, with further discounts for monastics and students.

## Introduction

There is a growing number of Indian and international participants at Tibet House who are showing a keen interest to delve deeper into various Buddhist subjects studied and practiced in the tradition of Nalanda and Tibetan monastic universities. Keeping them in mind, a new Masters Course is being offered which is in line with that sophisticated tradition.

This Masters Course is not a substitute for a formal degree course from a registered university. Rather, this course is being offered to participant practitioners, who wish to further their knowledge of various Buddhist subjects, in order to deepen their understanding and apply them to their Dharma practice.

The study and knowledge of Buddhism is extremely vast and profound. In the monastic tradition, it routinely takes a few decades to properly study all subjects and undertake this journey. This is a wonderful and rare opportunity to commit oneself to such a course, even while being a layperson. Since there are number of people who are more seriously interested in Buddhist philosophy and at the same time in the midst of busy lives in cities, with other engagements and commitments, this course is designed specifically to accommodate them.

This being a pilot programme, limitations are bound to be there. Tibet House requests the understanding and co-operation of all participants.

## Teaching Format

Classes will be held mostly at Tibet House, Delhi. There will be two semesters in each

year, along with breaks.

**Classes for Masters Advance Level:** There will be 3 teaching sessions per week. The classes will be held on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings. Each session will be approximately 2-3 hours. Sometimes, sessions may be held during other days also.

**Classes for Masters Proficiency Level:** There would be 4-6 teachings sessions per week. There may be daylong weekend teachings also for this level of Masters course.

Additionally, there will be group discussions and debate sessions for both the levels, in order to deepen the learning imparted during the classes.

An online education portal will allow participation in this course via the **online mode**. This will also allow regular participants to keep up with the ongoing classes if they cannot attend them at Tibet House, Delhi. Audio/Video recordings of the classes will be made available via the online education portal, to all the participants admitted to the course. The online education portal will also allow participants to have discussions via designated forums.

## Teachers

The primary teacher for this course will be Venerable Geshe Dorji Damdul La. However, Tibet House, Delhi, will also invite other teachers to give teachings now and then. Based on availability of Guest teachers, the teaching schedule might change and the changes would be communicated to course participants, in advance to the best of our abilities.

## Levels, Subjects, Duration and Course Fees

The Masters Course will be offered at two levels – Advance Level and Proficiency Level.

Advance Level is for four years.

Proficiency Level is for two years after the Advance Level.

Details of Subject, Duration and Course fees, for each level, are set out in the table below. Please note the discounted rate for those who are monastics and students in recognized schools, colleges and universities (for them, applicable course fees will be only 25% of what is listed below).

Please note there will be extra charges for course material for each subject, which will be very nominal and on a cost basis only.

Please also note there will be extra charges for the Examination Mode (please refer to the "Modes - Assignment Versus Examination" section in this document).

For Advance Level, the per year examination fees (in addition to course fees and course material fees) will be INR 300 for monastics & students and INR 1200 for all other participants.

For Proficiency Level, the per year examination fees (in addition to course fees and course material fees) will be INR 450 for monastics & students and INR 1800 for all other participants.

The above course fees are highly subsidized due to the kindness of Ministry of Culture, Indian Government. This allows as many people as possible to avail of the benefits of this course, without regard to their financial means.

## Modes - Assignment Versus Examination

The Masters course is designed to accommodate two types of participants - those who

would like to participate to receive teachings and do simple assignments, but not undertake frequent examinations due to personal reasons, such as having limited time. The other type of participants are those who would like to receive teachings and are willing to undergo various examinations, on a frequent basis.

Both the Advance and Proficiency Level will therefore be offered in two modes - Assignment versus Examination Mode.

In both the modes, teachers, teachings, class timings, course material etc. will remain same. The only difference will be that in the Examination Mode, the participant will have to put in more effort for various examinations and pay additional examination fees.

At the time of completing admission formalities, an applicant in Advance Level (during the period 12-Dec-16 to 30-Dec-16) will have to choose one of these modes - Assignment or Examination Mode.

Once the mode is chosen, a participant may change only from the Examination Mode to the Assignment Mode, and that too, only once during the whole duration of the Advance Level or Proficiency Level. It is not possible to make the switch the other way, i.e. once the participant selects the Assignment Mode, she / he cannot change to Examination Mode.

Participants may note that at the time of entry to first the Advanced Level, and then the Proficiency Level, they may make this decision afresh on whether to apply to the Assignment or Examination Mode. In other words, it is not necessary for a candidate wishing to apply for the Examination Mode at the Proficiency Level to have completed the Advanced Level in the Examination Mode (if that is the case, the participant will obviously have to learn to exert more effort to sit for exams in this new Examination Mode). A participant must have completed the Advanced Level in either mode before applying to the Proficiency Level, however.

### **Examination Mode Charges**

For Advance Level per year examination fees (in addition to course fees and course material fees) will be INR 300 for monastics & students and INR 1200 for all other participants.

For Proficiency Level per year examination fees (in addition to course fees and course material fees) will be INR 450 for monastics & students and INR 1800 for all other participants.

The additional charge for the Examination Mode is to cover administrative expenses.

## **Admission Process**

### **Who can apply?**

Anyone who genuinely wants to deepen their study and understanding of Buddhism can

apply, however they should have some basic knowledge about Buddhism. Any person residing anywhere across the globe, with a sincere desire to learn, may apply (i.e. participants may complete this course via the **online mode**).

## How to apply and the admission process?

**Step 1)** Fill in the Registration Form send to masterscourse@tibethouse.in OR send the physical copy to Tibet House. The Registration Form can be found on the Tibet House website: (Click → [Registration Form For Masters Course-Updated.doc](#))

**Step 2)** Submit Fees for Application Processing and Registration (INR 300 for monastics & students and INR 1200 for all other applicants) with Tibet House, Delhi. Applicants based in India can pay via – Cash, Cheque, Demand Draft or Bank Transfers in Indian Rupees.

Checks and Demand Drafts should be in favor of '**Tibet House, New Delhi**'.

**International Applicants, based out of India, can pay via only Bank Transfer.**

(Tibet House, Delhi tried to explore the possibility to allow payments via Paypal for international applicants but unfortunately as per Paypal India, non-profit organizations like ours cannot receive payments via Paypal so the only way Tibet House can receive payments is via the bank transfer.)

- Step 3)** A user id and password will be sent to the email id mentioned in the Registration Form for the education portal.
- Step 4)** Start preparing for assignments for all the Foundational Topics by listening to the recordings for these topics, supplemented by Additional Readings. Please see below for list of Foundational Topics and Additional Readings. To be well versed in these topics, is a pre-requisite for Masters Course Advance Level.
- Step 5)** Submit assignment for each group by the deadline of dates mentioned below in the "Steps/Stages - Applicable Dates" Table via education portal login given to you, once your registration process is complete.
- Step 6)** Applicants who successfully complete all the assignments for the Foundational Topics may be invited for personal interviews. For applicants who are based out of Delhi, this will be done via Skype or any other suitable means.
- Step 7)** Complete the admission process formalities with Tibet House, Delhi. This will include paying the course fees and course material fees for at least the first year.
- Step 8)** Before commencement of each year ( if not already paid ) the course fees (based on mode) and the course material fees will have to be deposited with Tibet House, Delhi, in advance. Payment related details would be same as mentioned in Step 2. Please note if the payment is made based on Examination Mode and if the participant chooses to change to Assignment Mode, Tibet House will not be able to refund any Examination Fess (the difference of amount in fees for the two modes).

The Course Fees Per Year can be paid as per the table below.

*Please note if a participant likes, she or he can also pay the course fees for more than one year ( for example for two, three or the whole four years for Advance Level ) , specifically international participants if it helps them to save on bank transfer charges. But for the Proficiency Level, we will only accept payments towards the end of Advance Level.*

## Applicant Assessment Criterion

To be able to assess knowledge of applicants, online assignments will have to be completed based on given topics and audio recordings of earlier teachings given by Venerable Geshe Dorji Damdul La, and some selected teachings given by His Holiness the Dalai Lama. The topics taught by Venerable Geshe Dorji Damdul La are referred to as *Foundational Topics*, and selected teachings by His Holiness the Dalai Lama are referred as *Additional Readings for the Foundational Topics*.

These *Foundational Topics* have been divided into three groups and the assignment for each group will be conducted online. *Additional Readings for the Foundational Topics* are recommended strongly to deepen one's knowledge and understanding of these Foundational Topics.

**It is mandatory for all applicants to submit assignments for the all the three groups of Foundational Topics.**

These assignments are online quizzes which are combination of objective plus subjective questions. An applicant can only make one attempt for each Foundational Topic Group assignment. So each applicant has to submit only one assignment for each Foundational Topic - Group A, B and C but they can choose when they want to submit these assignments as per the table below.

**It is strongly recommended for participants, if they have no compelling constraints, to submit Foundational Topics Assignments before actual teachings of Masters Course begin on 04/Jan/2017. The extension of assignment submission window to 31/Mar/2017 has been done to allow intake of applicants to this course till 08/Dec/2016.**
